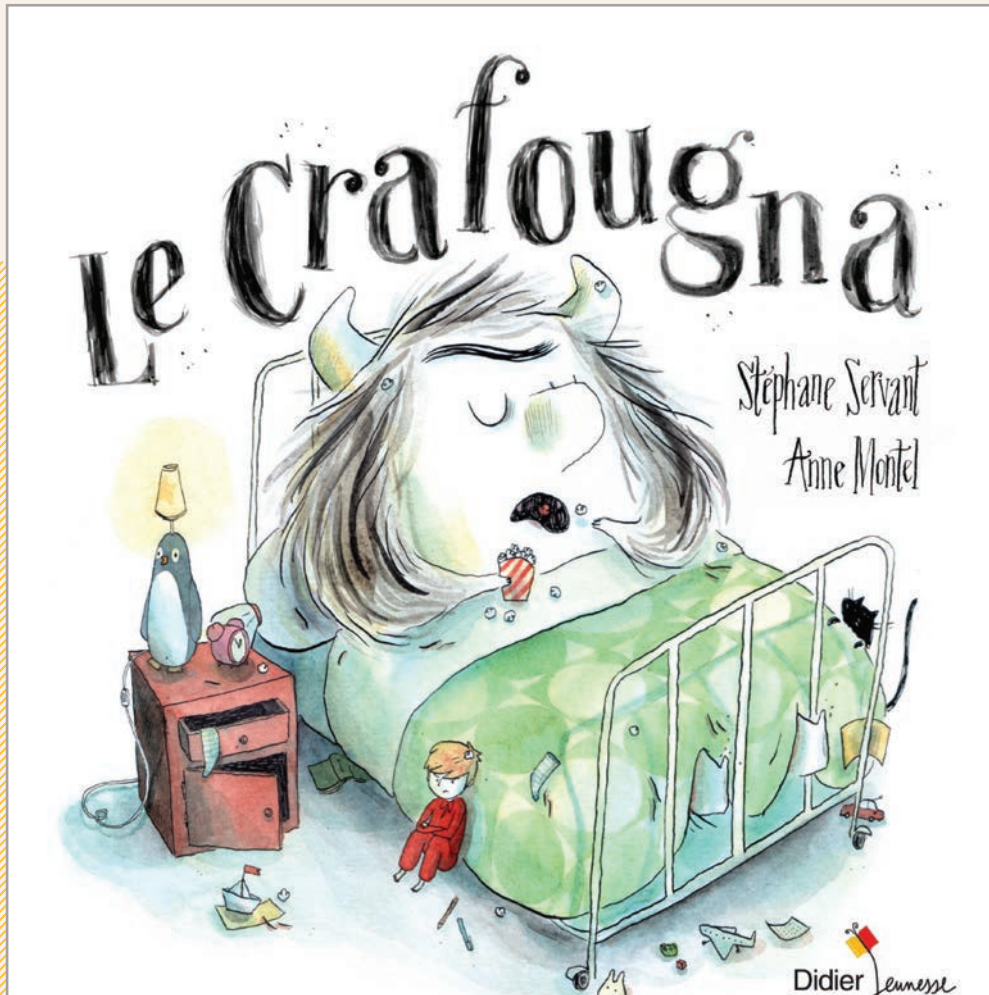
# THE CRAFOUNA

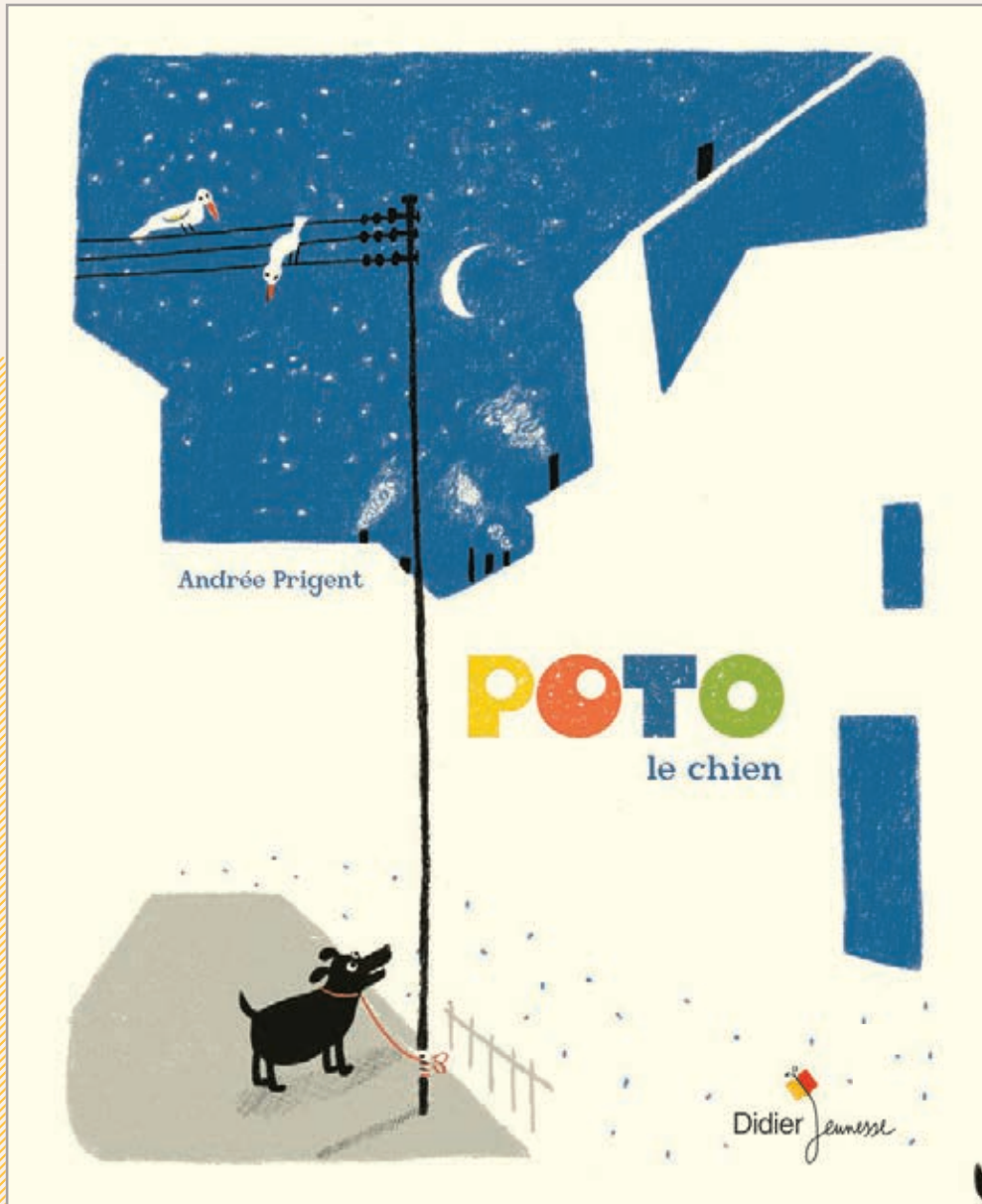
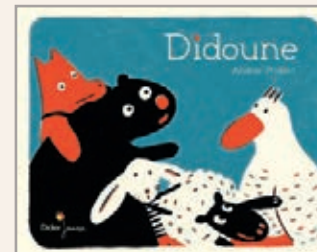


# POTO THE DOG

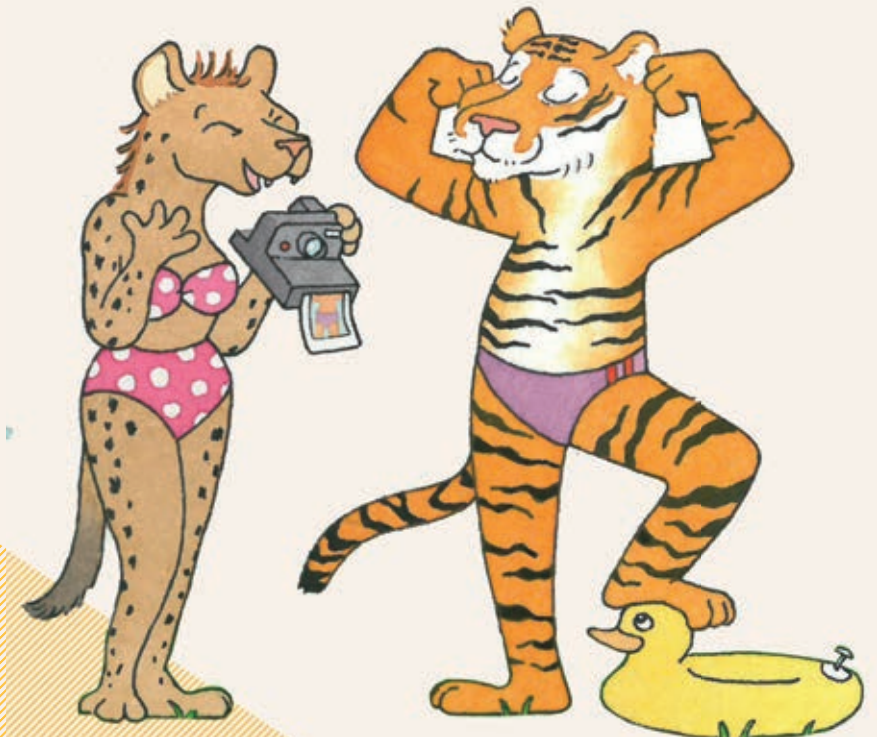

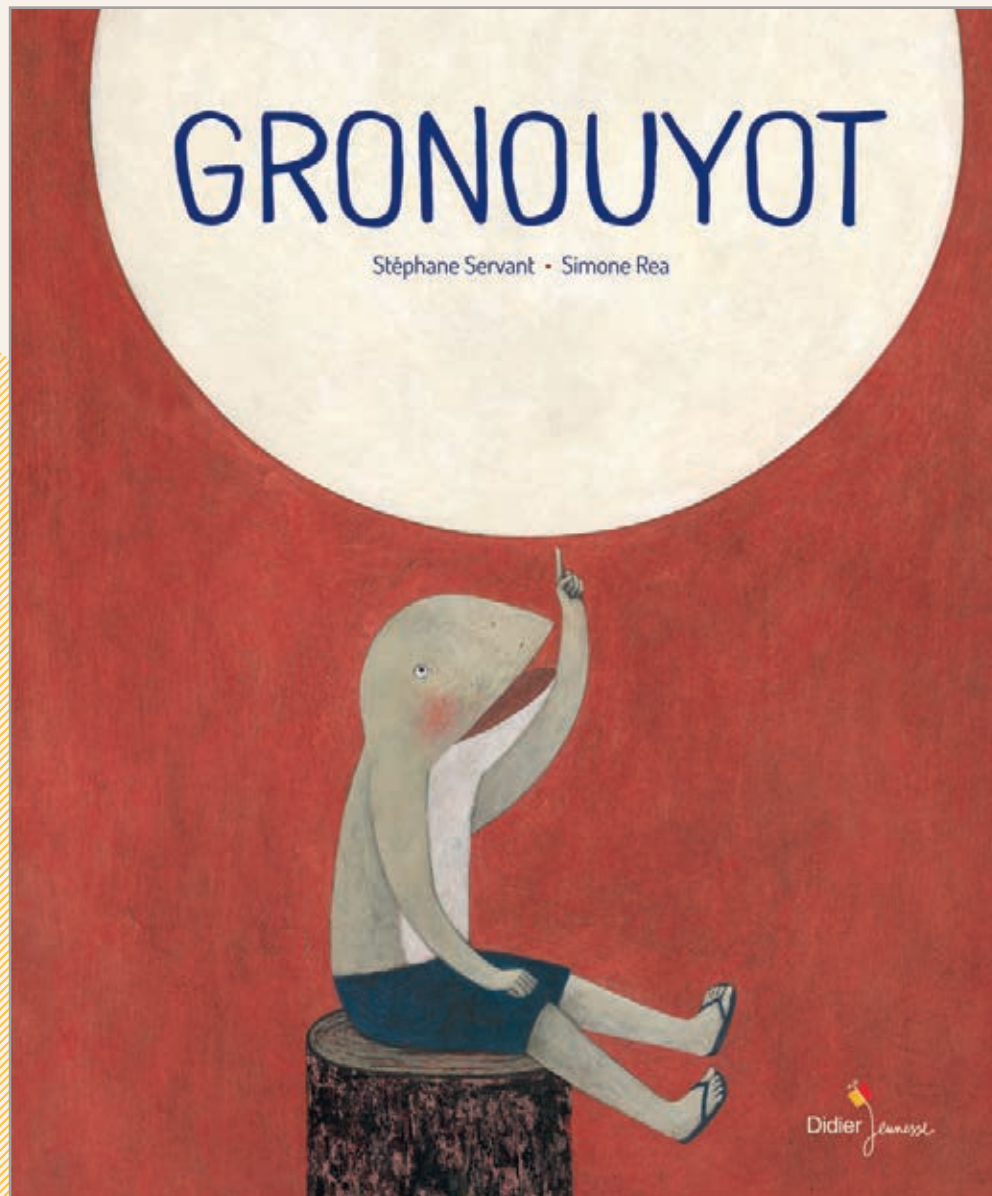

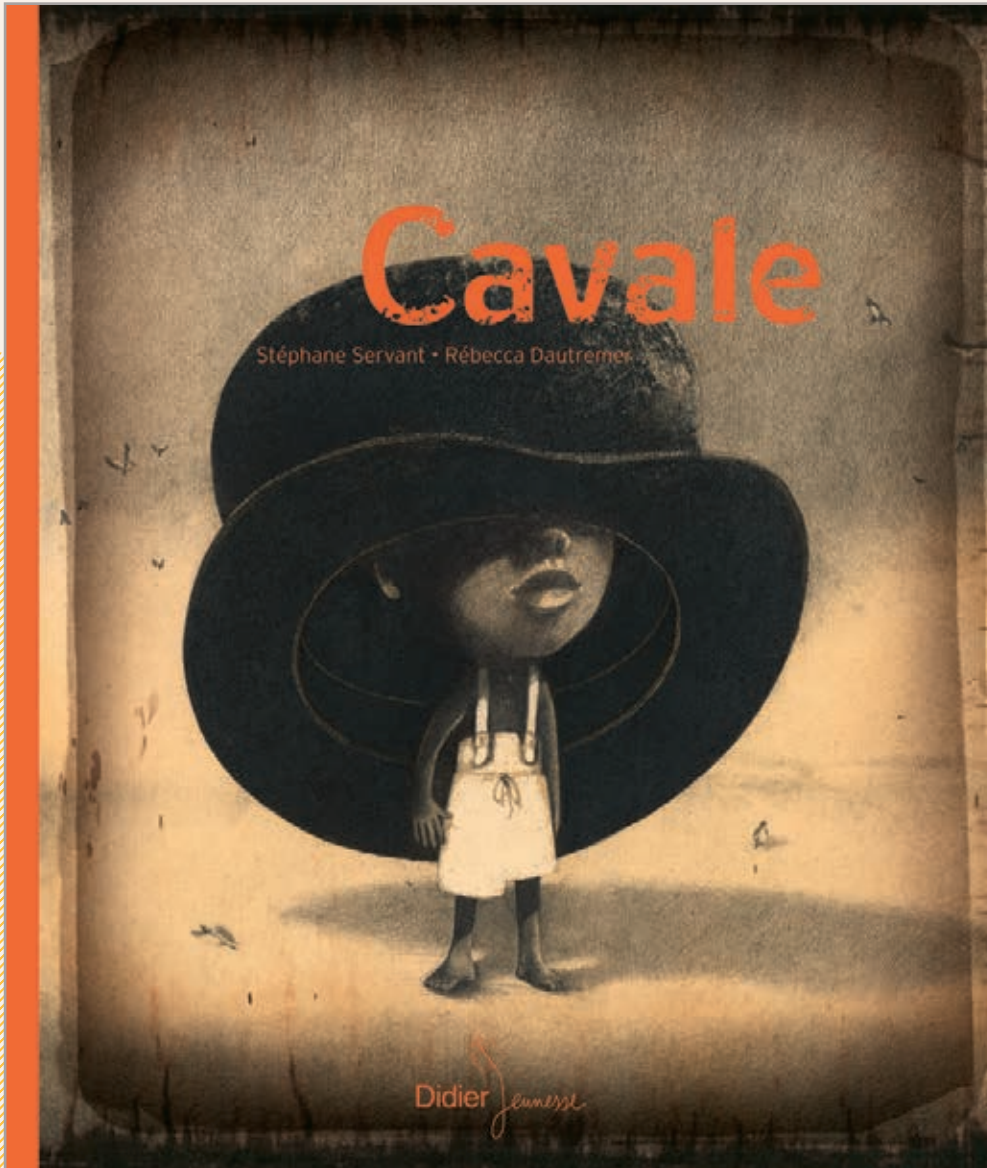


# RUNAWAY
