

A first introduction to the great Viennese waltzes of Johann Strauss II, illustrated with elegance and lyricism by Delphine Renon to mark the bicentennial of the composer's birth.

This new classical sound book features 5 buttons (90 seconds total) with some of Johann Strauss II's most famous pieces: The Blue Danube, The Emperor Waltz, Tritsch-Tratsch Polka, Die Fledermaus, and Voices of Spring. Johann Strauss II helped popularize the waltz in Viennese salons and then across Europe. His melodies are beloved by the public, especially the world-famous Blue Danube.

Delphine Renon beautifully captures the refinement and opulence of Vienna: shimmering ballrooms, orchestras, flower-filled parks, and period clothing. She also invites readers to admire the refreshing beauty of Austrian valleys and mountain landscapes. Older readers will enjoy spotting nods to the iconic Empress Sissi: riding along the Danube aboard the royal boat, dances in the grand ballroom, the details of the Emperor's uniform... It's a true journey back in time!

The third adventure of Mimi and Tosca the cat, dancing under falling snowflakes to the music of Johannes Brahms.

On this beautiful winter morning, Mimi and Tosca the cat discover their garden completely transformed by snow. What joy! Mimi leaves footprints in the snow, climbs a tree, and shakes snow down onto Tosca... who does not like it one bit and runs off! Where did Tosca go? Mimi is very worried and searches for him. Phew! The mischievous Tosca soon returns—for a big cuddle.

This new adventure is set to 5 sound buttons featuring music from the Hungarian Dances (1869) by Johannes Brahms. Originally composed for four hands at the piano, the 21 Hungarian Dances were later arranged for orchestra by Brahms and other composers.

Beneath a luminous pink sky, Anaïs Brunet's landscapes are blanketed in thick snow, highlighted with pops of color from plants and animals—deer, pheasants, rabbits, chickadees, and a fox—making for a refreshing discovery of winter in a sparkling snowy garden.

This is the third book in Anaïs Brunet's seasonal series, already praised for the quality of its previous titles on autumn and summer.

This sound book features 5 buttons (90 seconds total) with five beautiful jazz lullabies, performed in their original English versions by the most legendary voices of the genre: Lullaby in Blue by Debbie Reynolds, My Sleepy Head by Nat King Cole, Hit the Road to Dreamland by Mel Tormé, Lullaby of the Leaves by Connie Boswell, and Hush-a-bye by Bing Crosby.

Following the success of The Most Beautiful Jazz Lullabies (book & CD set) and Jazz Lullabies and Ballads (board book), this sound book takes little ones into a jazzy world of gentle melodies at bedtime.

Stéphanie Desbenoit reimagines the Iullabies in natural settings, each matched with a meaningful and distinctive atmosphere: an underwater world, a snowy countryside, an autumn forest... Different animals appear throughout, reflecting the landscapes and seasons. The magical, dreamlike illustrations pair perfectly with the music, creating a soft, lyrical bedtime experience.

Three of the five tracks are original productions by Didier Jeunesse. Translations of the song excerpts are available at the end of the book.

A sound-filled journey deep into the Amazon rainforest to discover and listen to tropical animals in the wild.

An exotic sound book with 5 sound buttons (90 seconds total) to explore the calls of iconic animals of the Amazon: the toucan, spider monkey, sloth, blue poison dart frog, and jaguar.

Each animal sound is accompanied by a natural, authentic jungle ambiance: the chattering of hungry toucans and the calls of mischievous monkeys mix with the sounds of nature, while the sloth's subtle noises and the jaguar's roar blend with birdsong, and the frog's croaking is accompanied by the sound of water. In this way, little ones can discover wild animals in their natural habitats.

A passionate traveler, Alexandra Huard is fascinated by tropical rainforests. Drawing inspiration from her journey up the Amazon River by boat, she paints the landscapes, colors, and moods of this little sound book with realism and sensitivity. Each animal is paired with a signature plant and shown alongside other jungle creatures, celebrating the rainforest's rich biodiversity of flora and fauna.

The little brother wonders—is it true or not? The clever twist at the end will surprise everyone!


Alexandre Juza has fun blurring the line between reality and imagination, questioning what's real and what's not, and then flipping the story on its head. Kids and grown-ups alike







In a second reading, kids will love spotting clues about each predator and fun nods to classic fairy tales!








A marvelous pop-up book where a house grows and grows to welcome all kinds of forest friends.


In this new adventure, Little Worm joyfully journeys through the four seasons, meeting garden animals and watching nature transform. A fun exploration of life both underground and above, in every season!


Just like in Little Worm in the Garden, the reader's finger can slip into the hole in the book to become Little Worm—the main character in a lively adventure set in a cheerful garden.

Maurèen Poignonec delights in painting the garden year-round, adding little signature details: spring flowers, a summer grasshopper, autumn mushrooms and chestnuts, winter frost...

Both the author and illustrator are committed to environmental and climate causes, once again offering little ones a vibrant, hands-on way to discover nature and its inhabitants. When Kira the caterpillar finds herself trapped one evening in a strange green sarcophagus, there's only one thing to do: call Supercat, the animal superhero!






Bulle and Bob are off on their twelfth adventure, this time in search of hidden treasure with their grandma and cousins!

Natalie Tual offers a warm and tender look at the relationship between cousins and highlights the theme of cooperation between young and









A playful and tasty Hungarian folktale from the "Little Steps" collection.

"One morning, Felix wakes up with a big cloud hanging over his head. The cloud blocks out the sunlight. On the way to school, Felix feels like the cloud is sinking lower and lower. It makes him hunch down more and more. Now the cloud is so low that Felix has to lie down. Felix and the cloud don't move. They just lie there, right in the middle of the path."

Luckily for Felix, his friends come by, one by one, and sit down beside him to help. Each brings their own personality and their own idea, and little by little, Felix's cloud begins to lift. The five friends walk off together, laughing under a bright blue sky. Now a beautiful day can begin!

Maylis Daufresne offers young readers a gentle and poetic text that sensitively addresses emotions and the worries that sometimes weigh us down—like clouds pressing on us—but also shows how friends can be there to help us stand up again. The story is delicate, imaginative, and child-centered, making understandable and relatable.




A powerful story about a friendship duo shaken by the arrival of someone new.

When he appeared at the very end of the path, Max saw him first. He didn't say anything.

The next day, when he came back, Max recognized him. This time, Louis saw him too. He wasn't tall or short. He was the New Kid. Max and Louis were playing ball. For the first time, Louis threw it a little too hard. The ball hit the New Kid. And the New Kid threw it back. Then Louis laughed and threw it again. That seemed normal. But Max, being left out, felt sad. That was the first time.

With sensitivity and simplicity, Nadine Brun-Cosme explores the challenges of forming new friendships and the uneasiness that can arise when a pair becomes a trio. One by one, Max, Louis, and the New Kid each feel rejected, jealous, or lonely. But in the end, they realize that playing together as three is possible. The arrival of someone new doesn't erase a friendship—it can expand it and even reinvent it.

The author subtly explores how we relate to others, how we feel about ourselves, and the nature of friendship. The storytelling places the reader in quiet observation of each character's emotions, their shifting perspectives, and what each one is feeling.

Exactly the size of a hug..."

A tender, emotional story that captures the power of a mother's love—ever-changing in form as children grow, but always the same in its beauty and simplicity, like a hug.

Maële Vincensini's text reads like a mother's gentle response to her daughter, a love letter without a trace of sentimentality. It wraps around the reader like their favorite blankie... Originally shared on Instagram, this text had over 2.5 million views and more than 97,000 likes—proof of its simple, powerful, and universal message.

Barbara Brun's watercolor and ink illustrations are light, luminous, and filled with tenderness. The gentle expressions, body language, and cozy settings give the book the feeling of a cherished family keepsake—precious and timeless.

Every age is the perfect size for a hug. And every age is perfect for this infinitely tender book.






A gentle and comforting picture book about the passing of time, the fear of change, and the worries that come with growing up.

After Shamal and Bora, the "Ronronneurs" series welcomes a new character and his fuzzy raccoon family.

The raccoon family is celebrating the birthday of Marcotte's little sister. "Make a wish! Close your eyes!" But when she opens her eyes again... the candles are gone! And without candles, there's no birthday. This is the fifth birthday that's been stolen this year. Far away, Marcotte hurries to Grandma Escarbille's workshop. Once inside, he pulls out a big box holding all the stolen birthdays. "For every candle not blown out, I get to keep them a little closer to me."

Set within a happy racoon family, Nejma Bourouaha delicately and poetically explores a child's fear of change. Each candle blown out means Marcotte's siblings are growing up—and growing away from him. It disrupts his familiar routine, the life he knows and loves. But Marcotte will learn that change also brings new discoveries and new happy moments to share.

The story also highlights intergenerational bonds and the value of passing down love and understanding. With soft, gouache strokes, Nejma Bourouaha paints an utterly charming raccoon family.



A charming and funny picture book about rivalry and learning to live together.
Because it's better to build bridges than walls!

Mr. Hedgehog and Mr. Dormouse live on either side of a puddle at the edge of the forest. With them, it's each to his own side, each to his own burrow! The two don't like each other, and whenever they cross paths, it always ends in name-calling... They never run out of insults! One winter evening, when Mr. Dormouse throws a big apple from a tree onto his neighbor's quills, that's the last straw! Mr. Hedgehog goes to find Dung Beetle and asks him to build a big wall between him and Dormouse, in exchange for a few seeds and slugs. "You have until spring! Good night!" says Mr. Hedgehog, slamming the log door of his burrow

But when winter ends and the two neighbors wake up, they find that, instead of the wall they asked for, Dung Beetle has built... a bridge! And guess what? From misunderstandings to polite exchanges, from hesitation to reconciliation, Dormouse and Hedgehog end up becoming... inseparable!

Anne Crahay took inspiration by an anonymous philosophical fable ("The Bridge Builder") to explore how we relate to others and live together. Just like in The Bear and the Finch, her previous book inspired by a Socratic fable, she presents the story with lightness and simplicity, in a way that speaks to children—playing with witty, spicy dialogue between Dormouse and Hedgehog that makes the duo both hilarious and endearing.


But what could possibly be more terrifyingly awful than all these creatures?


A giant hand swallows up a heroine-who hasn't said her last word.






A hilarious new character with serious comic potential... who thinks he's a professional monster.
